CFPB v. Najia Jalan, National Legal Help Center, Inc., and Richard Nelsen - Case No. SACV12-02088 AG (ANx)

Background:

The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, or CFPB, filed a lawsuit against Najia Jalan, Richard Nelsen, National Legal Help Center, Inc., and related companies for violating federal law. The CFPB alleged that the defendants violated the Dodd-Frank Act and Regulation O, also known as the Mortgage Assistance Relief Services Rule. These laws prohibit unfair, deceptive, or abusive acts or practices and protect distressed homeowners from mortgage relief scams.
