Make your graphic organizer


- Obtain paper, scissors, and markers from your teacher.
- Review these steps to make a two-tab interactive graphic organizer.
- 1 Fold the sheet horizontally, like a table tent.




2 With the paper horizontal and the fold at the top, fold the paper in half.



3 Open the fold. There should be a visible fold line down the center.



4 Place one hand between the two sides of the paper to separate them.



- 5 Cut along the fold line of one side of the paper, creating two tabs.
 - Label the left tab: Need to pay back
 - Label the right tab: Don't need to pay back
 - Under each tab, list examples of ways to pay for your higher education that fit within that category.
